"I am requesting a funding level of \$1,530,342 for the Combatting Crime through Integrate Substance Use Disorder Treatment, Education and Prevention Program as a community project funding request in fiscal year 2025. The intended recipient is the Beit T'Shuvah, located at 8831 Venice Blvd. Los Angeles, CA 90034. The project would be a valuable use of taxpayer funds because the funding would be used to improve the safety of the community by reducing drug-related crime through quality substance-use disorder treatment and recovery services for justice-involved clients – thereby safeguarding personal and public property, protecting human life, increasing employment, and decreasing long-term Federal and State government spending on incarceration for drug-related crimes.

The project has a Federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes described in section 501 of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C. § 10152).
